### Other events include:

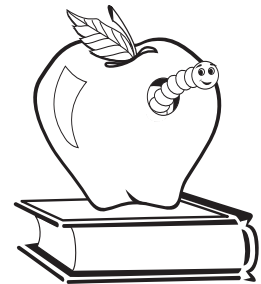
- Girls Nite Out

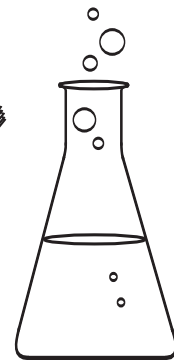
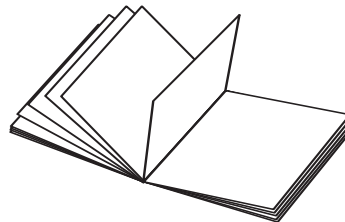

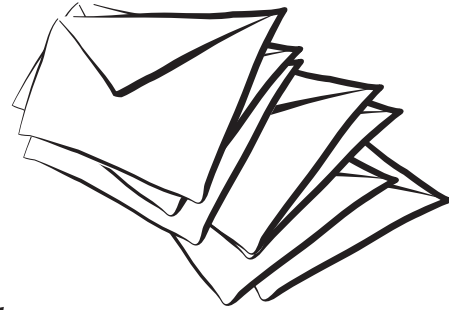

# “SCHOOL SURVEY RESULTS”

At the end of the 2007-2008 school year, all school parents of Kindergarten through 8th grade students were surveyed to gain an understanding of their thoughts on our school and also to seek out any areas of opportunity or improvement. We are happy to report that survey results were very positive. Out of 219 school families surveyed, we received 134 responses.



## Some highlights of the survey results include:

96.1% of respondents feel that St. Dorothy's is a safe environment for their children. Of those, 67% felt very strongly about this.

95.3% of respondents were satisfied with the overall quality of the education. 11.5% of those said that the education 'exceeded their expectations.'

95.3% of respondents were satisfied with St. Dorothy's impact on their children's growth in the Catholic faith.

94.6% of respondents felt that St. Dorothy's is a welcoming environment. Of those, 60% felt very strongly about this.

89.4% of respondents said that they were likely to refer others to St. Dorothy School – of those 47.7% said that they were “absolutely likely” to refer others.

88.4% of respondents felt that their children have grown as critical thinkers because of their St. Dorothy experience.

86.7% of respondents were more than satisfied with parent-teacher communications.

80.7% of respondents were more than satisfied with communications with Mrs. Sheehan, School Principal

80.3% of respondents are satisfied with the quality of non-sports related extra curricular activities offered by St. Dorothy's.

There were an overwhelming number of survey respondents who commented that the sense of community is what they like best about the St. Dorothy School experience. Fr. Murphy, our Pastor, commented that “this is a tribute not only to the school staff, but also to each of the parents, volunteers and anyone else who involves themselves in any way in our school activities.” In the written comments section of the survey, many of our

wonderful teachers were also singled out as well as Fr. Murphy's and Mrs. Sheehan's continued efforts to maintain a quality education at St. Dorothy School.

We will continue to work on the areas of improvement as demonstrated in the survey. This includes constantly evaluating our educational experience, our technology and finally the communications process with the parents.

5th Grade - 33
6th Grade - 50
7th Grade - 33
8th Grade - 41
<b>Total = 360</b>

During our early meetings in 2005, the Development Committee realized that enrollment stability was vital to the success of St. Dorothy School. While declining in many other Catholic schools, St. Dorothy's enrollment has stabilized. The focus of our efforts centered around Kindergarten and increased marketing of the school. In 2006, we added a second Kindergarten and began marketing the school more aggressively. Our Kindergarten Open House held every November and the activities surrounding Catholic School's Week every January have helped to stabilize our enrollment. It should be noted that our current 6th grade class of 50 students is the largest grade since the Graduating Class of 2006 with 56 students. Enrollment stability and growth remains a top priority.

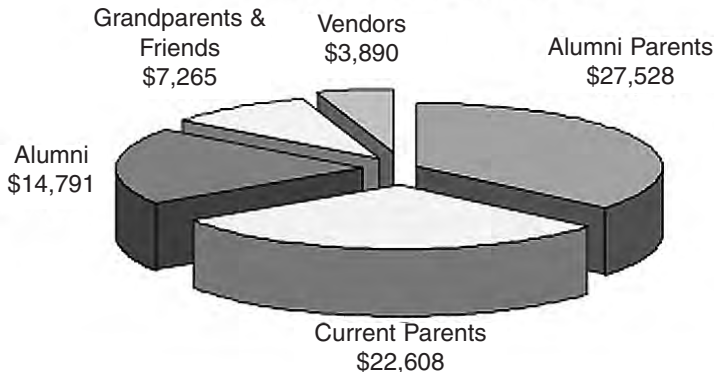
